This weekend marks the 225th anniversary of the birth of the Unitarian minister and American author, Ralph Waldo Emerson.

On the night Emerson's five-year-old son died of scarlet fever, he wrote four letters to relatives describing his son and began to compose his poem, "Threnody." Richard Higgins writes "Anybody who says that Emerson didn't suffer, that he didn't have an adequate sense of the awful things that happen in life, that he was just a feel-good optimist, simply doesn't know the man. Emerson's optimism is so strong because it was fired in his grief." On this Sunday of Memorial Day weekend we look at the relationship of grief and creativity.

Ed was born on August 24, 1918, and was looking forward to celebrating his 100th birthday this year. He received a degree in architecture from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and a master's degree in city planning from Harvard.

Ed and Iris married in 1957 and celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary last year. They were members of First Unitarian Church of Baltimore before moving to Timonium when The Towson

Unitarian Universalist Church was still located on Bosley Avenue. Their children, David and Mary Anne, attended Sunday School classes at The Towson Unitarian Universalist Church. Ed was a gentleman. His keen intellect enjoyed probing history, religion, culture, and politics. He was a renaissance person and a patron of the arts. And he was a gentle man who took a genuine interest in others. Ed Park will be greatly missed.

OUR GOUCHER STUDENT

For those of you who are new to TUUC, our congregation is helping to sponsor a student at Goucher College. Our agreement specifies that the student come from a country on the "banned" list.

He will be taking one class at Goucher and the rest at CCBC for the summer term. Two wonderful TUUC members have stepped forward to lend him vehicles so he can get back and forth to school. He will be living in the dorm on the Goucher Campus.

We have made a commitment for \$5000 per semester. This summer semester will not cost near as much as the regular school year. So we are hoping to raise \$1000 to help him through this summer. We will resume our regular \$5000 commitment in the fall. Our student, Parsa Sheikholeslami, is from Iran. He was at Goucher for the fall semester, but, due to health issues, had to take the spring semester off. He is returning for the summer due to visa requirements.

GREETERS NEEDED

"Let us be a house of welcome." Those are words from the closing hymn we sang a few weeks ago. In order to live up to that imperative we need you to help us out by welcoming visitors to our services each week at the Greeters' Table at the front door.

What does it take to be a TUUC greeter? You should be kind, thoughtful, and a good listener...that means anyone in our congregation qualifies! It helps if you remember how uncertain you were when you first came to TUUC or a Unitarian Universalist service, since that will be a connection you have with first time visitors, too. What are your obligations? It's a convenient and easy way to give service. Arrive 25-30 minutes before the service begins to greet visitors, and stay 20 minutes after the service to reconnect and find out how what visitors thought of the service and how we can further find ways for them to explore TUUC as their spiritual home. You get to pick the dates and service times when you can do this. Each month there's a Doodle poll sent out to the list of greeters. Sign up for the service that fits your schedule.

So could you give us less than an hour once a month or even once every other month? If so let us know at the Greeters' Table that you would like to add your name to our team list or contact Jane Selewach directly. Please share your smiles, your reasons for coming to TUUC, and your warmth. Let's make sure visitors, new members, and one another know that we are a "house of welcome."



UUA GENERAL ASSEMBLY



Every year in June, the Unitarian Universalist Association convenes a General

Assembly to pass resolutions and provide direction on use of UUA resources in matters of social action. There are numerous worship opportunities and workshops on various topics, including church administration, humanism, leadership development, religious exploration, and social justice.

This year, GA will be in Kansas City, Missouri from June 20 until 24. Registration opens on March 1. There is a cost for registration, which is higher if you attend in person. Participation online is possible for a lower fee. More information can be found at https://www.uua.org/ga. Registering early is recommended as the cost goes up closer to the event. If you would like attend in person, the UUA has blocked rooms at local hotels for discounted rates. However, these rooms tend to go quickly; so registering early will ensure housing.

TUUC has been allotted five delegates. Delegates vote in the general sessions on Actions of Immediate Witness, Congregational Study Issues, and Bylaws changes. Although being there in person is best, you can be an off-site delegate and participate remotely via computer. 
To Give a Blessing is to Say "Yes" to a Person's Belovedness

The spiritual question for June is, "What does it mean to be a people of blessing?" To answer this question in a way that speaks to theists, atheists, agnostics, and humanists alike, Henri Nouwen defined a blessing as an affirmation of another's Belovedness. He was not alone. Dr. Norbert Capek created the Flower Ceremony for his congregation in Prague as a form of communion in which all could partake. At the end of the formal church year, he invited members to bring a flower, from their garden, symbolic of themselves. At the end of the ceremony, each member took home a flower brought by another. In this way, through this ritual of blessing, the congregation affirmed the belovedness of every person. Today, we will explore the question, "What does it mean to be a people of blessing?" by welcoming new members who have joined us since January and by celebrating Dr. Capek's Flower Ceremony. Please bring a flower

representing yourself. You will take home a flower brought by another.
