January 12, 2020, 9:30 AM and 11:15 AM **Rev. Clare L. Petersberger, Nancy Hannah:** Near the Heart and the Life of Our Being

Sixty years ago, on January 10, 1960, The Towson Unitarian Fellowship held its first worship service at the (then) Women's Club in Towson. Four years later, Leon Branum wrote a poem about this congregation. He said the church is a home, a place, near the heart and the life of the being of people. Today we ask, "What of TUUC's history is important to remember in order to be a people of integrity?"

January 19, 2020, 9:30 and 11:15 AM **Rev. Clare L. Petersberger:** Family Planning: A Special and Urgent Concern

In 1966, Planned Parenthood Federation Of America presented The Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. with the Margaret Sanger Award for his courageous position, in the 1950's, in support of contraception. His position was unusual for Southern preachers of his time. He gave his acceptance speech the title of today's worship service. What might he say about threats to reproductive justice today? And, more importantly, what are we, as a people of integrity, preparing to do about this special and urgent concern?

RELIGIOUS EXPLORATION

Our three younger groups will start out upstairs in the service and then be sung down to join with friends new and old for their class or group.

Kindergarten/First Grade Creating Home: Our Worship Home

This session offers opportunities for participants to explore some elements common to faith home worship. Children will experiment with artistic and written expression of their own worship experiences. You may decide to incorporate their creations into a congregational worship experience. Most activities can be adapted to your own faith home worship expressions, and all honor the particular stages and places where children are in their lives. Remember that the diversity that brings richness to Unitarian Universalist worship embraces differences in the age as well as the beliefs and experiences of every worshipper. Children are co-creators of our faith homes and the future of our Unitarian Universalist faith. This session introduces a role for them in our worship.

2nd/3rd Grade Moral Tales: Justice for All

This session teaches children about injustice and inequality in our world, and the importance of working for justice. Participants will hear a story about a kingdom in which many people do not have enough food. A dog that is larger-than-life comes to the palace and refuses to stop barking until the king has redistributed the wealth and everyone in the land has been fed. Through an "unfair snack" activity, the children will experience injustice first-hand, and then have the opportunity to turn that injustice into justice. Participants will be encouraged to be like the dog in the story, acting as allies to anyone who is oppressed, suffering, or being treated unfairly. "Fairness" will be added to the Moral Compass.

4th-6th Grade Harry and UU: Fighting Hatred

This group started discussing the horcrux of hatred last week. This week participants will make scarves to donate to a drop-in shelter that helps teens experiencing homelessness. Many teens are pushed into leaving home because of their sexual orientation.

Our Whole Lives sexuality education (7th-9th) Gender Expression

This group continues to have great discussions about dealing with sexuality, health, and values. The topic this Sunday is gender expression. This group meets at 11 am in Room 6.

YRUU Integrity

This group meets at 11:15 in Room 7. They will start planning the worship service that they present in February. The discussion theme for this month is Integrity.




