SOCIAL ACTION COMMITTEE SUNDAY'S COLLECTION DONATES TO FOOD FOR THE NEEDY

During the pandemic, unemployment and the need for food have skyrocketed, so ACTC is giving bags of food to the needy *six times* as often as before. Plus, it continues to provide lunches to the homeless.

If you <u>text</u> a donation, please word the command like this: \$10 Plate.

E-MAIL SPOOFING AND PHISHING

It appears that someone (or a group of people) are trolling Unitarian Universalist websites looking for the names, e-mail addresses, and photographs of leaders in congregations to create fake e-mail accounts (called spoofing) and, if anyone responds, to try to elicit money (called phishing.) On May 2, someone did so with a photograph of me from the TUUC website. They also incorporated my legitimate church e-mail address into a fake Gmail account. Please know that neither I nor any TUUC lay leader would ever ask you for a personal financial favor. Also, I do not sign my e-mails

with "God bless." Should you receive such an e-mail, ostensibly from me, or another TUUC leader, please don't click on any links. Just discard it. Then, please let me know so that I may alert authorities who are empowered to stop these scams. ---Rev. Clare

SECURITY MEASURES FOR VIRTUAL WORSHIP ON SUNDAY

On Fridays we will e-mail you the Zoom Meeting ID and password for the Sunday service. This will be a new meeting ID and password from the previous week. You will need to enter both to join worship. The password will not be available via any other TUUC communication channel. Please look for this e-mail on Friday and save it to a safe place.

Please log-on to worship by 10:15 a.m. on Sunday. Expect to spend a few minutes in the waiting room. The technical ushers will ensure that the meeting settings are adjusted prior to letting in participants. It is helpful if you set up a free Zoom account with your first and last names. Otherwise, Zoom will pick up the name of your device, which in some cases may be "iPhone". This doesn't help us to confirm who is seeking to enter.

If you know of a visitor or guest who would like to join our service, please provide their information to churchoffice@towsonuuc.org by Thursday at 4 pm. Thank you for your patience and understanding as we work to ensure that our virtual worship space is as safe as possible.

If you haven't yet set up Zoom and would like assistance, please call the church office at 410-825-6045 and leave a message.

Messages are being checked. We have volunteers who will speak with you on the phone and provide assistance.

It is necessary to download software on your computer to run Zoom. Go to zoom.us and follow the instructions. If you want to access Zoom on a smart phone or a tablet, you will need to download the app.





We do ask that you identify yourself by your first and last name when joining worship or a program on Zoom. We suggest creating a free account with Zoom; then your name will be filled in automatically when you join a meeting.

CLARE'S COLLOQUY ON COVID CARE FUND

While preparing the TUUC Needs Assessment in March, I noticed that questions that colleagues were asking members of their congregation included "Would you be willing to contribute to a fund to help members in financial need?" and "Are you in need of financial assistance?"

Since then, I have received four inquiries from TUUC members asking if we could establish such a fund to support members and friends who have lost their jobs due to Covid. These members generously offered to donate as an expression of our mission to deepen our ethical and spiritual lives by exemplifying what it means to be a caring community. One person offered to make a contribution out of the CARES check being sent by the government. I was touched by these inquiries and the spirit of compassion in which they were made.

At its meeting on May 20, the TUUC Board voted to establish a TUUC Covid Care Fund for up to two years for the purpose of helping TUUC members who are in financial distress due to this pandemic. Policies for the Covid Care Fund include those advocated by the UUA: https://www.uua.org/leadership/library/money-matters/ministers-discretionary-fund

I am under no illusion that we are going to be able to meet all the financial needs that exist among us or will emerge in the next 12 to 18 months. But my hope is that some assistance with paying for a member's prescription, or toward rent or mortgage, or for groceries (if not eligible for ACTC assistance) will help to ease economic hardship due to Covid and help members going through tough times to feel the love and support of TUUC.

If you are able to donate to our newly established TUUC Covid Care Fund, please let our Bookkeeper know that your contribution is for the TUUC Covid Care Fund. Also, please know that no contribution may be designated for the benefit of a particular recipient.

If you are in need of financial assistance, please speak with me. All requests will be kept confidential.

In no way is this fund intended to take away from our support of the Assistance Center of Towson Churches. In fact, our fifth Sunday collection this coming Sunday, May 31, will be for the Assistance Center of Towson Churches. ACTC is in great need as they continue to work to provide food to people who are food deprived.

Our mission is to deepen our ethical and spiritual lives through service to others. Thank you for your compassion and for your generosity as we seek to care both for those within our spiritual community and those in the wider community. In the words of George Odell:

We need one another when we mourn and would be comforted... when we are in trouble and afraid... when we despair, in temptation, and need to be recalled to our best selves again.

We need one another when we would accomplish some great purpose, and cannot do it alone... in the hour of our successes, when we look for someone to share our triumphs [and] in the hour of our defeat when with encouragement we might endure and stand again.... All our lives we are in need, and others are in need of us.

UUA GENERAL ASSEMBLY

General Assembly, the annual gathering of UUs to worship, vote, and do the work of our denomination, was planned to be held in Providence, RI this year. It has been switched to a 100% virtual event from June 24 through 28. There is a registration fee of \$150 and there are opportunities for scholarships from the UUA, as well as volunteer opportunities for those with technical skills. Registered



participants will have access to the GA Virtual Participation Portal, which combines multiple modes of participant engagement that include chat, Q&A, and polling. Registrants are able to watch and ask questions in live sessions including workshops and business sessions. Delegates are also be able to propose amendments in the live business sessions, participate in debates, and vote in general sessions. Some sessions will be streamed for all to view, without paying a registration fee.

Recently, I posted a link to Faithify.org on TUUC's Facebook page. Faithify is a web site for crowd funding of UU Projects. Following is more information. Faithify is a crowdfunding site where passionate people INSPIRE, UNITE, and FUND Unitarian Universalist ministries.

Faithify's purpose is to:

- Inspire a culture of innovation that extends the reach of UU values
- Lower the walls between existing congregations
- Ignite ministries in new venues, formats, and communities
- Bridge geographic and generational borders using 21st century technologies
- Help passionate individuals invest directly in ministries that excite them
- Help ministry innovators reach a passionate public

We envision a people with renewed faith and a Unitarian Universalism that is more connected, relevant, and vibrant.

Crowdfunding has fundamentally changed how we fund-raise. In being able to mobilize resources from everyday people, and rely on thousands of smaller donors rather than the institutional backing from governments, foundations, or even select donors with big pockets, now anyone can raise thousands of dollars with just the click of a button.

Changes in technology, culture, and newer generational mindsets are offering us new possibilities. Crowdfunding offers not only a new way of raising funds but a new way of thinking about how to get things done and where to focus our limited energies and highly motivated spirits to amplify the good work we are already doing.

Since then, Faithify.org has become Unitarian Universalism's crowdfunding site, where passionate individuals can invest directly in ministries that excite them. Our 80% success

Please know that you will get news of what comes next for me!

You have been an integral part of my growth as a minister and chaplain. Keep moving toward this new way of doing the work of the church, cherish and remain committed to your community partners, keep your mission and vision in mind and heart even in the midst of pandemic limitations. Because Spirit calls strongly in uncertain times, and the "answer is Under Construction." Thank you so much for taking a chance on sponsoring a ministerial intern! 


