This box contained a gift from TUUC in honor of my twenty years serving as your minister. I shook the box and determined, from the weight, that it could not be a chalice or a book.

Inside, there was a card. It read:

"Dear Rev. Clare,

First of all, let me say congratulations on your 20 years at Towson UU Church. I looked at many photos both on the website and Facebook and you are obviously well loved!

I hope you love your commemorative stole. I decided to create 20 different flowers to each represent a year. Some years need fiddly care, some are a bit fruity, some are weedy and all are loved. So there is a mix of the same kinds of flowers.

The Sunflower is a sort of stylized chalice. There are also Dogwoods, Petunias, Dandelions, Iris, Purple coneflower, Bleeding Heart, Lilies of the Valley, Daisy Poppies, pansies, Bee Balm, Marigolds, Queen Anne's Lace, Hydrangea, Daffodils, Trumpet Honeysuckle, Lilac, Blackberries, and a Rose. The stole is truly a work of art!. The sunflower contains Jen Larson's chalice design.

DENOMINATIONAL MINUTE JULY 3, 2020: GENERAL ASSEMBLY 2020

The Unitarian Universalist Association held its first all virtual General Assembly Wednesday June 24 through Sunday June 28. The theme was "Rooted, Inspired and Ready". More than 4800 UU's registered and everything that happens at a face to face GA happened at this one. There were business sessions to discuss and vote on a number of issues, most of which were procedural. Delegates heard the long awaited report of the Commission on Institutional Change. However, they declined at this GA to endorse or accept any of the Commission's recommendation.

There were dozens of workshops, some attended by as many as 600 registrants. And there were the usual worship services including the Opening Celebration, Service of The Living Tradition, and Sunday Morning Worship. Those in attendance at the Sunday Morning worship service posted hundreds of compliments after. Besides an outstanding sermon and other spoken words, there was a virtual choir of 150 voices. Next year's General Assembly is scheduled for Milwaukee June 23-27. There has been some discussion, based on his year's success, to alternate face to face with all virtual GA's. The face to face GA's will continue to have virtual business sessions and other on line events as has been the practice the past few years.




