FINDING THE RIGHT BALANCE

The Administrative Team has decided to make it easier for visitors to find their way to our virtual Sunday services, while still maintaining strong security measures to keep out those who might disrupt us.

Our Sunday services still require a password to enter and everyone starts in a waiting room. Everyone enters muted. Participants are not permitted to unmute or rename themselves. Participants may only chat with the host and co-hosts. The password is not embedded in the link to the meeting. The meeting ID changes every week.

In addition to emailing the meeting information to congregants and to repeat visitors, we are starting to include the Zoom meeting ID and password in the Threshold and on the church calendar. Both of these locations require humans to click several times from our church home page, making it less likely that bots will find the link. We will also create a public Facebook event, directing people to contact Zoommtg@towsonuuc.org to obtain the login information.

UUA GENERAL ASSEMBLY REPORTBY SUE ROYER

Over the next two months, each of us who attended the UUA 2020 General Assembly will provide a short report. After the UUA announced that the entire assembly would be online, I volunteered to be part of the technical team. My application was accepted, resulting in my conference registration fee being waived. I connected with other members of the "Tech Deck" team; we got to know each other on daily calls prior to GA. I got to see some of the behind the scenes workings of a big conference. I edited many PowerPoint slides and was the person showing the slides during some of the general business sessions.

Over 4000 people attended General Assembly. The theme was Rooted, Inspired, Ready. There were many programs that highlighted indigenous peoples and the impacts of colonialism. We accessed the conference through a web portal designed by the UUA staff; it worked quite well!

I will share a random list of ideas that came to me while attending workshops, general business sessions, worship services, and small group networking events:

- Start(ed) reading Decolonizing Wealth:
 Indigenous Wisdom to Heal Divides and
 Restore Balance, by Edgar Villaneuva
- Put half or all of our Endowment into

socially responsible investments

- Put Coming of Age graduates and definitely high school seniors who are graduating on our membership role so that they receive the Threshold and the UU World and stay connected to their faith community
- Have a youth member on Lay Worship Associates
- Move funds from the operating budget to supplement the plate percentage to go to our social action community partners during this time when plate intake is lower
- Buy small chalices for congregants to use at home
- Get used laptops and/or iPads for those who don't have devices at home
- Move away from Robert's Rules and toward circles/consensus for decisionmaking
- Use Restorative Circles for Right Relations
- Engender more trust in the Board to make

- budget decisions so that we have the flexibility to be responsive
- Start work on discussing and adopting the 8th Principle
- Pay the registration fee out of the church budget for a person to attend GA – for a lay leader who has not previously attended
- Put the pride flag and trans flag on our website and our Facebook page
- Get our congregation more involved with UU the Vote
- Recognize the indigenous peoples who occupied the land that we now occupy regularly, as we start services

These are all ideas, just ideas for now, except for the book that I have starting reading. Some of these ideas might turn into actions and some might not. You can see what inspired me from this year's General Assembly. Ask me about it. I'm rooted, inspired, and ready!


