CLARE'S COLLOQUY

"What does it mean to be a people who listen deeply?" This is our spiritual question for October.

Deep down, I believe each and every person yearns to be heard, yearns to have another listen to their thoughts, their emotions, their passions. This is how we share who we are and what is important to us. This is how we become known as unique and unrepeatable human beings.

Our Soul Matters Sharing Circle encourages the practice of deep listening as a spiritual practice. Too often we hear what another says and immediately jump in with our own life experience. The other person is left feeling unheard. Deep listening invites us to give another the gift of being heard without interruption.

But what works at an interpersonal level is no longer working for me when it comes to the headlines.

I've decided not to listen to those who are actively working to harm, tear down, and demean others.

I was raised to believe that everyone deserves to be heard. And, at an interpersonal level, I still believe that.

But I no longer believe that everything needs to be heard that is broadcast on the news or on social media.

I'm choosing to listen to those who share sources and facts; to voices of reason, and to the still small voice of conscience.

For me, part of what it means to be a people who listen deeply is deciding whose voices are not being heard----for they are often the ones who need to be heard most. As leaders of TUUC, we end Board meetings and Program Council meetings with the question, "Who might we have forgotten to include in our discussions, deliberations, and decisions?"

Ask and answer that question, and, as Joyce Sutphen writes, "This is your chance to listen carefully. Your whole life might depend on what you hear."

GOVERNANCE UPDATE AND CALL TO SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING By Sue Royer, President

We conducted four listening sessions in September, to review the key elements of the proposed Bylaws revision. You'll find a link to the slides here.




It became clear during discussion at one of the listening

sessions, that the age required to be a Member was not clear, nor was it clear how members of the Nominating Committee were selected. Also, we received an amendment about Board meetings, which the Board accepted with modification. The Bylaws version that was sent on September 18 includes those three updates.

We are working with a law firm with expertise in Maryland church law. They are helping us not only with the Bylaws, but with an amendment and restatement of our Articles of Incorporation. (Yes, TUUC is incorporated!).

Here are some questions that came up during the listening sessions, along with the answers:

Q: What is the number for a quorum changing to?



Q: What is the percentage of Members required to approve a Called Minister? A: Ninety (90) percent of the Members must vote in favor to call a Minister. The quorum for a Special Congregational Meeting to call a minister is 50 percent of the Members. In our current Bylaws, we require eighty (80) percent of the Members to vote in favor to call a Minister.

Q: What is a contract minister?

A: Examples of contract ministers are an interim minister and a ministerial intern. Contract ministers are hired without a congregational vote.

Q: Why the change to the Endowment Committee from being elected to being appointed by the Board?

A: Under Maryland law, the Board of Trustees is the fiduciary for TUUC's Endowment. Rev. David Pyle, in his assessment of TUUC's governance in 2016, recommended that the members of the Endowment Committee be appointed by the Board.

Q: Why is the portion of the Endowment Fund that goes to the annual operating budget being changed from 4% to "up to 5%"?

A: The Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (UPMIFA), which is a national standard and also part of Maryland law, allows for up to 7% of the value to be spent in any year. It also requires that the amount be based on the average market value of the endowment investments over the 12 quarters (or more) immediately

preceding the calculation. This aspect of UPMIFA applies only to permanent restricted endowments, which are restricted by the donor or law. By allowing up to 5% of TUUC's Endowment to be directed to the operating budget, this provides greater flexibility in budgeting and planning at TUUC.

Q: I see we have a provision for Youth Members, age 16 to 18. How will this affect the financial contribution that we owe the UUA each year?

A: We want to encourage youth who have gone through the Coming of Age program and/or who are active in the YRUU program to become members of the church. Under Maryland law, those under 18 are not permitted to vote on certain matters, which is laid out in the proposed Bylaws. The UUA changed the dues formula several years ago; now it is based on our annual budget rather than the number of Members.

Q: How are the members of the Nominating Committee selected?
A: The Chair is appointed by the Board. The remaining members are elected by the Congregation at the annual meeting.

Also at the listening sessions, several former members of the Board expressed their appreciation for this work. They are happy that we've been able to follow-through to complete the revision of the Bylaws in support of an improved form of governance.

The Board of Trustees is calling a Congregational Meeting for Sunday, October 25, 2020 on Zoom with check-in starting at 11:45 am. The purpose of this meeting is to vote on the proposed Bylaws and to vote on amended Articles of Incorporation. If you would like an Absentee Ballot, please contact **secretary@towsonuuc.org**. Note that Proposed amendments to the Bylaws must be submitted in writing to **secretary@towsonuuc.org** by 5 pm on Monday, September 28. Amendments will not be accepted on the floor of the meeting.

BIPOC CAUCUS



TUUC AUCTION 2020—DIAMOND JUBLIATION! OCT 11 - NOV 21

Our 2020 "Diamond Jubilation!" Auction is now present in a big way on the TUUC website. To get there from the home page, go to EVENTS along the top and click on AUCTION. You can also find the AUCTION link on the left side if you're viewing the church calendar. Click here for a preview. You'll find everything you need to know about the Auction: News, schedules, how to donate, descriptions of donations, how to enter the Auction and bid, the Auction Night program, and Help and Support with links to get personal responses to questions or problems that you might be having. The



Auction section is updated frequently so be sure to check back regularly.

Please keep the donations coming. Bidding this year is extended. While we'll continue accepting donations, please try to submit your donation(s) before bidding starts on October 11th. This will give them maximum exposure to interested buyers and help boost the Auction's success. It will also help the Auction Committee finalize the list of "Live" (Auction night only) items and prevent some donations from being unnecessarily blocked from open bidding.

Be sure to get on *Bid Beacon*, our virtual auction software—via *this link*. You'll need to be on Bid Beacon to get an up-to-the-minute view of all that's being offered and the current bid and availability statuses. Most importantly, you need to be on Bid Beacon in order to bid. As in past years, some of the very best items and activities are being offered at a fixed price and sell-out quickly once bidding is opened. With this year's extended hidding period, you may be disar



opened. With this year's extended bidding period, you may be disappointed if you wait very long after bidding opens on October $11^{\rm th}$ to enter the Auction and start bidding.

You're able to "practice" bid at this time but all practice bids and sales will be erased at noon on October 11th when the Auction officially opens. Donations will continue to be added until just before Auction Night, November 21st so you'll want to get back on Bid Beacon often. Some of the top donations will be reserved for "Live" bidding and will only be made available during a brief period on Auction Night. These are analogous to the Voice Bid items in our traditional auction.

We are counting on volunteers to help with a variety of tasks before, during and after Auction Night. We need technical helpers, drivers, donation organizers, and proxy bidders. IN MEMORY OF THE REVEREND DAVID HICKS MACPHERSON

The Reverend David Hicks MacPherson, the first minister of our congregation, died, peacefully, on September 25, 2020 after a day of calls with friends and a week in which he celebrated his 92nd birthday.

Dave and I last spoke this past January as TUUC prepared to celebrate its Diamond Jubilee. I was somewhat surprised to have reached Dave as he was usually out biking! A decade ago, he traveled from Richmond to preach as part of TUUC celebrating its Golden Anniversary. He preached on "Who We Were, Are, And Ought To Be." He remembered the names of



members. He remembered this congregation's witness during the Civil Rights movement. He remembered finding, on our grounds, the shoes of a baby of people who were enslaved, over a century and a half ago, as part of Hampton Mansion.

The Richmond UU congregation wrote of The Reverend MacPherson, "He never missed an opportunity to share a story or an experience. He held deep convictions about social justice, and was a staunch advocate for inclusion and civil rights of all marginalized people. He lived out his faith through involvement in every community in which he lived, and saw the future of Unitarian Universalism in every young face he encountered."


A staunch Universalist, last January, David was writing an article for The Unitarian Universalist Association's World magazine on a Unitarian Universalist theology for the 21st century. Dave was a beloved minister and cherished colleague who was always ready to help and had a hearty laugh. He will be greatly missed.

Rev. Dave is survived by his daughter Dianna, son Duncan, granddaughter Erin, and grandson Ian. He was preceded in death by his wife, Dorothy, and his son Douglas. An online memorial service will be held on October 24, 2020 at 4 PM via the <u>First UU Church of Richmond, VA</u>. 
