# What does it mean to be a people of deep listening?

#### OCTOBER 25, 2020 - 10:30 AM BRUCE KNOTTS, DIRECTOR OF THE UNITARIAN UNIVERSALIST OFFICE AT THE UNITED NATIONS: UN SUNDAY: CLIMATE CHANGE

The United Nations celebrates its founding on October 24 of each year. This year is the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of that hope giving event. UU congregations and others often celebrate the closest Sunday to the anniversary as UN Sunday. We at TUUC return to that practice this Sunday, October 25. Sunday's topic will be the UU@UN and its focus on Climate Justice which was the topic of this year's UU@UN Spring Seminar.

Joining us virtually will be Bruce Knotts, the Director of the Unitarian Universalist Office at the UN (UU@UN). Members may remember Bruce's in-person visits in the past. Bruce was a Peace Corps Volunteer in Ethiopia. He worked for Raytheon in Saudi Arabia and on a World Bank contract in Somalia, before he joined the Department of State as a U.S. diplomat in 1984. In 2004, Bruce was elected to the Board of Gays and Lesbians in Foreign Affairs Agencies (GLIFAA). Bruce retired from the Foreign Service in 2007 and joined the Unitarian Universalist Office at the United Nations as its Executive Director at the beginning of 2008.

#### VIRTUAL VESPERS – OCTOBER 26 FROM 7-7:30 PM

Virtual Vespers is a contemplative service of readings and music. This is a time to rest from the demands of the world; to let go of stress; to meditate; and to deepen one's spiritual life.



#### YOUTH RELIGIOUS EXPLORATION

Four families met at Cromwell Valley Park last Sunday and enjoyed each other's company, as well as that of the resident chickens, turkeys, and frogs. We checked out the garden with its pond and fall flowers before heading down to the stream to follow the trail past the lime kilns. We hope to do this again from time to time to give folks time to see each other in person safely. This was the perfect follow up from their

discussion that morning of deep listening to nature.

**Kindergarten through 4th Grade Group:** Karen and Angela are enjoying the wonderful energy and attention of this group as they learn about the theme for each month. Each session includes a discussion of the story, check in and sharing of artwork before they settle in for a Soul Matters song for that month that prepares them for a meditation exercise, before extinguishing the chalice. The children are learning more at home by using the packet of materials and activities that are mailed out each month. This month, they were invited to make a pride flag, use crayons with different skin tones to draw portraits, and make Halloween cards for friends or family.

**5th through 7th Grade Group:** Ellie and Lou facilitate this group using a variety of resources, including episodes of the Simpsons that provide a framework for discussion of UU values and social justice issues.

**8th/9th Grade Group:** Eight participants just finished the last session of Our Whole Lives sexuality education and celebrated with a bonfire at TUUC. They will try out alternating between in-person gatherings outside and virtual meetings led by Larry and Spice using a curriculum based on the Twilight Zone.

**YRUU:** The youth group is now meeting virtually most Sundays at 1:30 pm, but also expressed a desire for more in person gatherings after a good turn-out for the bonfire on a Friday evening.

All classes are on hiatus this Sunday, October 25. We hope you enjoy some time in nature with family or friends. We look forward to seeing everyone on November 1.

We previously mentioned that our existing Articles of Incorporation conflict with our Bylaws in two areas and also were missing a purpose. In the Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation, the purpose of the religious corporation has been added, and the timing of the annual meeting has been removed. The timing of the annual meeting is stated in the Bylaws and is not required under Maryland law to be in the Articles. The age of membership is now 16 for Youth Members and 18 to serve as a Trustee. Youth Members are permitted under Maryland law to vote on any matters, but are not permitted to serve as Officers or Trustees.

# **CLARE'S COLLOQUY**

"What does it mean to be a people who listen deeply?" This is our spiritual question for October.

Deep down, I believe each and every person yearns to be heard, yearns to have another listen to their thoughts, their emotions, their passions. This is how we share who we are and what is important to us. This is how we become known as unique and unrepeatable human beings.

Our Soul Matters Sharing Circle encourages the practice of deep listening as a spiritual practice. Too often we hear what another says and immediately jump in with our own life experience. The other person is left feeling unheard. Deep listening invites us to give another the gift of being heard without interruption.

But what works at an interpersonal level is no longer working for me when it comes to the headlines.

I've decided not to listen to those who are actively working to harm, tear down, and demean others.

I was raised to believe that everyone deserves to be heard. And, at an interpersonal level, I still believe that.

But I no longer believe that everything needs to be heard that is broadcast on the news or on social media.

I'm choosing to listen to those who share sources and facts; to voices of reason, and to the still small voice of conscience.

For me, part of what it means to be a people who listen deeply is deciding whose voices are not being heard---for they are often the ones who need to be heard most. As leaders of TUUC, we end Board meetings and Program Council meetings with the question, "Who might we have forgotten to include in our discussions, deliberations, and decisions?"

Ask and answer that question, and, as Joyce Sutphen writes, "This is your chance to listen carefully. Your whole life might depend on what you hear."



#### JOIN THE TUUC CHOIR





# **DENOMINATIONAL MINUTE**




The 2020–2021 UUA Common Read is <u>Breathe: A Letter to</u> <u>My Sons</u> by Imani Perry, published by Beacon Press. Emotionally raw and deeply reflective, Imani Perry issues a challenge to society to see Black children as deserving of humanity.

She admits fear and frustration for her sons in a society that is increasingly racist and at times seems irredeemable. However, as a mother, feminist, writer, and intellectual, Perry offers an unfettered expression of love—finding beauty and possibility in life—and she

exhorts her children and their peers to find the courage to chart their own paths and find steady footing and inspiration in Black tradition. *Breathe* offers a broader meditation on race, gender, and the meaning of a life well lived and is also an unforgettable lesson in Black resistance and resilience.

We are in the midst of a historic national reckoning with what it means to live as a Black or Brown American and systems of institutional racism that have been operating since our country's founding. As UUA President, Rev. Susan Frederick-Gray, has written, "It matters that we support the uprisings whose goal is the liberation of Black people and communities who for too long have been crushed by white supremacy, militarism, and capitalism. We must find the sources within ourselves to give us courage in this moment. To resist. To risk. To sacrifice for this movement that needs all of us to succeed. To be midwives for a new era in which all of us will be free."
