Our Soul Matters question for February is, "What does it mean to be a people of beloved community?" Today, we reflect on various understandings of beloved community. Which one(s) will resonate with you? How do we experience, steward, and nurture beloved community as members and friends of The Towson Unitarian Universalist Church? Ross Gay's poem, *To the Fig Tree on 9th and Christian*, will be the focal point of tonight's vespers service on beloved community.



Our faith is an expansive one. Historically, UUs disagreed with those who believed that Jesus was the only way to get to heaven and instead we asserted that all people have goodness in them and God would ensure that all humanity was welcomed into God's love. That's why we have "Universalism" in our name, Unitarian Universalists. Universalists believed in "universal salvation" or universal goodness. This call of universalism was a call to continually expand our love to wider and wider circles until all of humanity (and the natural world) is embraced. So, what's one of the ways our faith guides us into becoming a people of Beloved Community? It tells us to "grow your love beyond boundaries!" Families with children in Kindergarten through 7th grade are invited to join us at 9 am on Sunday morning for a group meeting followed by breakout classes. 

NOTES FROM THE BOARD BY SUE ROYER, PRESIDENT

SPECIAL GIFTS

The Board extends our gratitude to Sue Shankroff for her leadership of the Special Gifts Committee for many years. This committee approved expenditures for many worthy projects for our church, including new computers for staff, new phones, a



defibrillator, moving a piano, and humidity control systems for our pianos, to name a few. The Board is continuing the work toward better financial transparency and accountability that started under Joe Tumbler's leadership as Finance Head. As part of this, going forward, we will no longer have a separate fund for Special Gifts. The Board has approved moving the remaining balance in Special Gifts to the Building Fund (see below). We express our deep appreciation to Sue Shankroff and those who served on the Special Gifts Committee over the years.

SPECIAL FUNDS

In addition to our Endowment, the Board has established the following restricted Special Funds:

- Memorial Garden Fund for the maintenance, repair and expansion of the Memorial Garden
- Building Fund for future capital projects approved by the Board
- Kate Venables Music Fund for music-related expenses, including, but not limited to, guest musician fees and music licenses
- COVID Care Fund established May, 2020, for up to two years, for distributions to members of our church community who are in financial need

The Board also set these parameters for undesignated gifts:

- less than \$3,000 will be allocated to operating cash reserves
- \$3,000 to \$5,999 will be allocated to the Building Fund
- \$6,000 or greater will be allocated 20% to the Building Fund and 80% to the Endowment Fund

CLARE'S COLLOQUY

What does it mean to be a people of beloved community?

What images of beloved community come to mind when you hear this question?

Do you see people gathered to worship; singing in the Choir; hearing the sorrows and joys that bind us together in the human condition; sharing a cup of fair trade coffee; dropping off meals to facilitate recovery and healing; asking "big questions and deeply listening to one another in religious exploration classes and support groups; collecting canned food; making casseroles; joining with other communities to care for the earth; answering the call to gather to witness to the need for justice?

The poet Forrest Hamer remembers the black church of his childhood and writes of the organist:

"when the sermon had been made...

We waited for the moment his fingers spoke in their tongues,

listened for the urgent translation into this:

We have returned to a blessed place;

Our family is here with us, even the dead and not-born;

We are journeying to the source of all wonder...

Amen"

I love Hamer's vision that Beloved Community includes the dead and not born....journeying to the source of all wonder.

This month will reflect on the practice of Beloved Community. One of these practices is stewardship, financially supporting our congregation's mission to deepen our spiritual and ethical lives by working for racial, social, and environmental justice.

We will be hearing from one another what TUUC means to us. We will be hearing things that really matters to us about our practice of Beloved Community. And we will be hearing our hopes for what TUUC will mean to the wider community in the year to come.

It has been almost a year since we moved into virtual space because of Covid-19. We miss seeing each other in person. Yet we know how much we need one another and that our affirmation of the inherent worth and dignity of every person and the free and responsible search for truth and meaning have never been more important.

As we consider #Beloved Community and #Commitment and make our pledge to TUUC, may we remember that when we gather together, like Forrest Hamer, "We return to a blessed place; our family is here with us, even the dead and not-born; we are journeying to the source of all wonder. Amen!"
