#### REV. CLARE L. PETERSBERGER, JOYCE DUNCAN: THE EIGHTH PRINCIPLE

The Unitarian Universalist Association is currently reviewing our seven principles. This process is similar to the one our congregation undertook to review our mission statement. At the UUA General Assembly in June, a delegate suggested adding the Eighth Principle as a preamble to the seven existing ones. What is the Eighth Principle? Why did this delegate suggest that it come before and not after the other seven? Her answer was the expectations of beloved community in the Eighth Principle. To her, they encompassed all the other principles. How does the Eighth Principle speak to your own vision for beloved community and the future of our faith?

# GREEN SANCTUARY—LEGISLATIVE ADVOCACY

The Green Sanctuary Committee prepared and submitted letters on 4 important issues pending in the Maryland legislature (click on links to see letters):

- 1. A constitutional amendment on environmental rights
- 2. <u>A prohibition on single-use plastic bags</u>
- 3. <u>A climate solutions bill that requires an acceleration in greenhouse gas reductions, targets</u> <u>overburdened communities, protects fossil fuel workers, and plants 5 million trees</u>
- 4. A bill targeting transit safety and investment

Because these bills were supported by the UU Legislative Ministry of Maryland, these letters were signed in the name of TUUC by President Sue Royer. They were submitted to Senator Chris West and Delegates Michele Guyton and Nino Mangione, as our church is in their district.



They work to educate, mobilize, and coordinate UUs on specific issues before the Maryland General Assembly. Working in coalition with established state and national organizations, they as UUs model a reverence for the interdependent web of all existence which fosters justice, health and equity in society. You are encouraged to join on this journey as we engage Marylanders, expand freedom and nurture an inclusive, life-affirming system of government.

## THESE ISSUES NEED OUR SUPPORT—HOW YOU CAN HELP

In Item 2 of the upcoming Maryland Legislative Session, you will find a few key measures which the Unitarian Universalist Legislative Ministry of MD (UULM-MD) supports. Voting on Item 2A occurred on Thursday, February 11.

Please vote to support the following measures:

Override the governor's vetoes of:

- 1. Women's prerelease centers <u>HB 801/SB 684</u>. Women receive no support on the transition from prison while men have a program.
- 2. Blueprint for Maryland (Kirwan Commission) <u>HB 1300</u>. The General Assembly passed a comprehensive overhaul of Maryland's education system with emphasis on early childhood education, teacher retraining, and college pathways. Overriding this veto is a step toward redressing oppressive systemic inequities.

Vote for:

- 1. Criminal justice reform: Repeal the Law Enforcement Bill of Rights (HB 151) and Police Reform and Accountability Act of 2021 - (<u>HB 670</u>)
- Climate change: Transportation Safety and Investment Act <u>HB 114 / SB 199</u> and Climate Solutions Now - <u>HB 583 / SB 414</u>

- 3. Economic Justice: Family and Medical Leave Insurance (FAMLI) Program Act <u>HB 375</u> / <u>SB</u> <u>211</u>
- 4. Healthcare: Health Equity Resource Communities Initiative <u>HB 463</u> / <u>SB 172</u>
- 5. Gun Violence Prevention: Require licensed dealer for all gun transfers <u>HB 4/SB 208</u> and fund the Maryland Violence Intervention and Prevention Program <u>SB 708</u>
- Immigration: The Maryland Trust Act <u>HB 304</u> / <u>SB 88</u> and MVA Data Sharing law <u>HB</u> <u>23</u> / <u>SB 234</u> to limit local cooperation with ICE and Dignity Not Detention - <u>HB 16</u> / <u>SB</u> <u>478</u> to end local contracts to imprison immigrants pending deportation
