This Sunday marks the one-year anniversary of the last time we met as a congregation in our building. We did not know then, as we lifted up the wisdom of clowning in the festivals of Purim and Holi, that we would find new ways to manifest our commitment to connection: meeting in virtual space for worship for the coming year; holding socially distanced classes, walks, meals; support groups; and other events outside in the warmer months. In affirmation of our commitment to creating new ways to connect, this morning we will be joining another UU congregation on the east coast. This congregational connection came through a connection our Minister made in seminary over 30 years ago. To what connections are you committed? And how do these connections bring you health and wholeness? To what connections might we commit together?

YOUTH RELIGIOUS EXPLORATION

When we think about commitment, we think first about our Unitarian Universalist commitment to asking questions and being curious. We encourage people to ask questions of wonder. We support people as they question norms and express doubt. Far from outlawing doubters and questioners, our faith places them at the center. CLARE'S COLLOQUY

What were you doing in the first two weeks of March 2020? When I go back and look in my email folder from a year ago, it reveals that on March 3, I inquired of the UUMA how to purchase a Zoom account. On March 4, I conversed with Walter Burnett, who taught public health, on a new procedure to disinfect our stones of joy and sorrow because of a new virus called Covid-19. We also planned to not have people greet their neighbor with handshakes on Sunday March 8 and decided that the offertory plates should not be passed hand-to-hand but rather left in the back. March 5, Mimi Marks and I emailed about hospitality and the use of gloves and utensils to serve. Also on March 5, Sue Royer and I communicated on a plan should it be necessary for staff to work from home. Within six days, the decision was made by the Program Council to take TUUC into virtual space just four days later. This was a lot of change in a very short period of time! With it came feelings of fear and loss and uncertainty.

One thing that was certain was the need to figure out how to stay physically apart in order to all be together "on the other side" of the pandemic while remaining connected emotionally and spiritually.

What has impressed me is your commitment to this goal---from sharing photos for virtual worship services to participating in socially distanced family walks; from sharing joys and sorrows and grieving illnesses and deaths in the chat on Sunday mornings to participating in our Phone Pals Program and talking to Lay Pastoral Associates during this challenging time; from participating in drive by celebrations such as honoring the seminary graduations of Karyn Marsh and Lora Powell Haney and pouring water in the TUUC parking lot for Water Communion to bringing Xmas ornaments to your devices to share on Christmas Eve; from teaching OWL in the grove and sponsoring Youth Group bonfires when the weather permitted to launching new virtual programs such as Vespers, Socrates Café, Our Messy Lives, and Writing Your Spiritual Autobiography; from continuing to support our community partners to building a bio-retention wall at TUUC!

Our spiritual question for March is, "What does it mean to be a people of commitment?" Great gratitude for your commitment to worship, study, socialize, serve, and work together for justice together during this time apart. Here's to anticipating a time when we can safely gather again!



UPCOMING PROGRAMS AT TUUC

GREEN SANCTUARY—LEGISLATIVE ADVOCACY

The Green Sanctuary Committee prepared and submitted letters on 4 important issues pending in the Maryland legislature (click on links to see letters):

GREEN SANCTUARY CONGREGATION

- 1. A constitutional amendment on environmental rights
- 2. A prohibition on single-use plastic bags
- 3. A climate solutions bill that requires an acceleration in greenhouse gas reductions, targets overburdened communities, protects fossil fuel workers, and plants 5 million trees
- 4. A bill targeting transit safety and investment

Because these bills were supported by the UU Legislative Ministry of Maryland, these letters were signed in the name of TUUC by President Sue Royer. They were submitted to Senator Chris West and Delegates Michele Guyton and Nino Mangione, as our church is in their district.

THESE ISSUES NEED OUR SUPPORT—HOW YOU CAN HELP

In Item 2 of the upcoming Maryland Legislative Session, you will find a few key measures which the Unitarian Universalist Legislative Ministry of MD (UULM-MD) supports. Voting on Item 2A occurred on Thursday, February 11.

Please vote to support the following measures:

- 1. **Criminal justice reform:** Repeal the Law Enforcement Bill of Rights (HB 151) and Police Reform and Accountability Act of 2021 (HB 670)
- 2. Climate Change: Transportation Safety and Investment Act (HB 114 / SB 199) and Climate Solutions Now (HB 583 / SB 414)
- 3. **Economic Justice:** Family and Medical Leave Insurance (FAMLI) Program Act (HB 375/SB 211) Family and Medical Leave Insurance (FAMLI) Program Act (HB 375/SB 211)
- 4. Healthcare: Health Equity Resource Communities Initiative (HB 463/SB 172)
- 5. **Gun Violence Prevention:** Require licensed dealer for all gun transfers (HB 4/SB 208) and fund the Maryland Violence Intervention and Prevention Program (SB708)
- 6. Immigration: The Maryland Trust Act (HB 304/SB 88) and MVA Data Sharing law (HB 23/SB 234) to limit local cooperation with ICE and Dignity Not Detention (HB 16/SB 478) to end local contracts to imprison immigrants pending deportation.


