Perhaps you, too, are old enough to remember when the start of Daylight Savings Time required a commitment to manually spring clocks forward an hour. Now technology does it for us. The same cannot be said for other changes in our lives from forming a new habit (like regular exercise) to working with others to dismantle systems of oppression. Having just lost an hour (but looking forward to longer hours of daylight) this morning we reflect on our commitment to change and what it requires.

YOUTH RELIGIOUS EXPLORATION

Our faith is a living tradition. We describe the six sources of our living tradition, instead of one holy book or one prophet (https://www.uua.org/beliefs/what-we-believe/sources). When we learn new things, we expect our faith to change. We vote on adding new sources and new principles, as well as changing them. We are committed to keeping an open mind about anything that might challenge and change our faith. So, what's one of the ways our faith guides us into becoming a people of Commitment? It tells us, "Everything changes, so be ready to keep growing!"

CLARE'S COLLOQUY

What were you doing in the first two weeks of March 2020? When I go back and look in my email folder from a year ago, it reveals that on March 3, I inquired of the UUMA how to purchase a Zoom account. On March 4, I conversed with Walter Burnett, who taught public health, on a new procedure to disinfect our stones of joy and sorrow because of a new virus called Covid-19. We also planned to not have people greet their neighbor with handshakes on Sunday March 8 and decided that the offertory plates should not be passed hand-to-hand but rather left in the back. March 5, Mimi Marks and I emailed about hospitality and the use of gloves and utensils to serve. Also on March 5, Sue Royer and I communicated on a plan should it be necessary for staff to work from home. Within six days, the decision was made by the Program Council to take TUUC into virtual space just four days later. This was a lot of change in a very short period of time! With it came feelings of fear and loss and uncertainty.

One thing that was certain was the need to figure out how to stay physically apart in order to all be together "on the other side" of the pandemic while remaining connected emotionally and spiritually.

What has impressed me is your commitment to this goal---from sharing photos for virtual worship services to participating in socially distanced family walks; from sharing joys and sorrows and grieving illnesses and deaths in the chat on Sunday mornings to participating in our Phone Pals Program and talking to Lay Pastoral Associates during this challenging time; from participating in drive by celebrations such as honoring the seminary graduations of Karyn Marsh and Lora Powell Haney and pouring water in the TUUC parking lot for Water Communion to bringing Xmas ornaments to your devices to share on Christmas Eve; from teaching OWL in the grove and sponsoring Youth Group bonfires when the weather permitted to launching new virtual programs such as Vespers, Socrates Café, Our Messy Lives, and Writing Your Spiritual Autobiography; from continuing to support our community partners to building a bio-retention wall at TUUC!

Our spiritual question for March is, "What does it mean to be a people of commitment?" Great gratitude for your commitment to worship, study, socialize, serve, and work together for justice together during this time apart. Here's to anticipating a time when we can safely gather again!
