CLARE'S COLLOQUY

Our spiritual theme for February is "Widening the Circle." What does this theme mean to you? When I first heard those words, in my mind's eye I saw a circle of 40 chairs at River Road Unitarian Universalist Church with colleagues in the Chesapeake chapter of the Unitarian Universalist Ministers Association. In pre-Covid times, when another colleague arrived, we needed to literally widen the circle. This entailed finding an extra chair for this colleague, bringing it to the "circle," and then colleagues "widening the circle" to make room for the extra chair and cherished colleague. It was not something that one person could do alone. It required effort by many individuals. Chairs scraped the floor in a wave as several people scooted back; smiles and waves were exchanged; sometimes there were further sounds of scraping as chairs were moved further back or forward to maintain something of the circle shape. Perfection was not the goal. Community was the goal.

Last winter, a hard copy of the report from the UUA Commission on Institutional Change, entitled "Widening The Circle Of Concern" sat on my desk (it still does!) The UUA Commission on Institutional Change was like the colleague arriving at the already formed circle. The report "Widening The Circle Of Concern" was like the extra chair---a means to become more inclusive. (The report may be accessed on-line, here: https://www.uua.org/uuagovernance/committees/cic/widening) Last winter, on Sunday afternoons, around 20 TUUC members and friends were like the colleagues moving their chairs back as we discussed the report's recommendations on ways to become an anti-racist, multi-cultural congregation and association of congregations. Sometimes we smiled. Sometimes we winced at the scraping sound of painful stories of exclusion. The report made it clear that perfection is not the goal. The goal is a more inclusive and welcoming community. The goal is Beloved Community.

As we continue to discuss the proposed Eighth Principle, with its vision "of journeying to spiritual wholeness by working to build a diverse multicultural Beloved Community by our actions that accountably dismantle racism and other oppressions in ourselves and our institutions" the image of Unitarian Universalists literally moving their chairs to create a more inclusive circle is appropriate. Widening our circle of concern will entail recognizing where we are in our current circle; making adjustments; changing some practices and intentionally "widening the circle." Perfection is not the goal. Community is the goal.

The Reverend Cristin Green will address the theme of "Widening the Circle" in worship with us on February 20th. She is the Assistant Minister for Congregational Life for the Unitarian Universalist Church of Fairfax, VA. I first heard Rev. Cristin Green in her role as Worship Arts coordinator for the Chesapeake chapter of the Unitarian Universalist Ministers Association. She is a member of Diverse & Revolutionary Unitarian Universalist Multicultural Ministries as well as Unitarian Universalist Professionals of Color. She is also a poet and musician. Please give The Reverend Cristin Green a warm TUUC welcome! Although you may not have to move your chair back when we gather for worship on February 20th, do smile, wave, and listen to her preach on the theme of widening the circle.

MAKE STONE SOUP WITH US ON FEBRUARY 6!

We invite you to make Stone Soup on February 6, Stewardship Sunday, as we tell this story in the worship service. This soup can be made easily from common ingredients listed below, or you can alter it to suit your own taste and whatever is in your pantry and refrigerator. If you assemble and chop ingredients ahead, the only effort involved will be a bit of sautéing while finishing your breakfast; then add the remaining items and keep on low heat while enjoying the service. During breakout rooms you can share your favorite soup variations with others and then your lunch awaits. Add some crusty bread and you will have a simple, delicious meal to warm you on a cold day.

Ingredients:

- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 onion, chopped (white, brown, yellow)
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 large carrot, chopped (about 1 1/4 cups)
- 2 celery ribs, chopped (about 1 1/4 cups)
- 2 cups dried lentils, green, red, or brown, rinsed
- 14 oz crushed tomato
- 6 cups vegetable or chicken stock or water
- 1/2 tsp each cumin and coriander powder
- 1 1/2 tsp paprika powder
- 2 dried bay leaves
- 1 lemon (zest + juice)
- 1/4 tsp salt and pepper, each, or to taste
- 1. Heat oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add garlic and onion, cook for 2 minutes.
- 2. Add celery and carrot. Cook for 7 10 minutes.
- 3. Add all remaining ingredients except the lemon and salt. Stir.
- 4. Increase heat and bring to simmer. Simmer for 35 40 minutes or until lentils are soft.
- 5. Remove bay leaves.
- 6. Add a touch of water if you want to adjust soup consistency. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Grate over the zest of the lemon then add a squeeze of lemon juice just before serving.


