

#### **CLARE'S COLLOQUY**

In a recent spring cleaning of our home, I discovered this post-it note.

It transported me to May 1, 2019. Walking into my office at TUUC, I was greeted with something new on my desk. The desk was cluttered. What stood out was a small vase with a sprig of lily of the valley. Below the vase was this note.

The flowers and note were from our Office Assistant, Nancy Hannah. The sweet smelling lily of the valley came from her home garden. The thoughtful gift came from her heart.



According to legend, on May 1, 1561, King Charles IX received a sprig of lily of the valley as a token of good luck. He was so appreciative that began the tradition of the Fête du Muguet in France. On May 1, family and friends give each other a sprig of lily of the valley to wish each other "bonne chance" and as a token of appreciation. It is also a reminder of the beauty of spring.

Holding the post- it-note in my hand, I thought about how the flowers of 2019 had faded; how the tiny vase was empty; how Nancy had not only retired in 2020 but had died on April 5th. I am not yet ready to part with her message which reminds me of the beauty of the lily of the valley and of Nancy who cultivated flowers and nurtured people!

This month, our Soul Matters theme is "Nurturing Beauty." Nurturing beauty is not just about awakening to the beauty of flowers. It is about planting seeds and cultivating their growth for future flowers. Nancy did not just savor beauty. She nurtured and shared it with others. This is part of her legacy.

In memory of Nancy, in honor of the Fête du Muguet, as a token of appreciation for you, and to inspire your reflection on how you are cultivating the true, the good, and the beautiful that will be part of your legacy, I leave you with a photo of lily of the valley---the flower for May!





#### **NEWS FROM THE A-TEAM**

In light of recent changes to the ACT NOW metrics, we are revising TUUC's Covid policy.

We are strongly encouraging vaccination because we are preparing to reopen our nursery and our youngest members cannot be vaccinated and some cannot wear a mask.

We are lifting capacity limits in the Meeting Room.

We still strongly encourage you to register on-line for worship and YRE for both planning and tracking purposes. However, we don't want you to not come and participate in worship or YRE because you didn't register in time. For tracking purposes, those who do not register will be asked to sign-in with a Greeter. Our goal is to avoid a bottle neck at the door.

For the time being, we will continue to mask inside the building---especially in larger groups such as worship.

We are looking for a volunteer to organize our hospitality team.

Although the nursery is not open yet, we are preparing to do so.

We hope these changes reflect the commitment of TUUC to be an inclusive community where people care for each other's well-being.




