

CLARE'S COLLOQUY

In a recent spring cleaning of our home, I discovered this post-it note.

It transported me to May 1, 2019. Walking into my office at TUUC, I was greeted with something new on my desk. The desk was cluttered. What stood out was a small vase with a sprig of lily of the valley. Below the vase was this note.

The flowers and note were from our Office Assistant, Nancy Hannah. The sweet smelling lily of the valley came from her home garden. The thoughtful gift came from her heart.



According to legend, on May 1, 1561, King Charles IX received a sprig of lily of the valley as a token of good luck. He was so appreciative that began the tradition of the Fête du Muguet in France. On May 1, family and friends give each other a sprig of lily of the valley to wish each other "bonne chance" and as a token of appreciation. It is also a reminder of the beauty of spring.

Holding the post- it-note in my hand, I thought about how the flowers of 2019 had faded; how the tiny vase was empty; how Nancy had not only retired in 2020 but had died on April 5th. I am not yet ready to part with her message which reminds me of the beauty of the lily of the valley and of Nancy who cultivated flowers and nurtured people!

This month, our Soul Matters theme is "Nurturing Beauty." Nurturing beauty is not just about awakening to the beauty of flowers. It is about planting seeds and cultivating their growth for future flowers. Nancy did not just savor beauty. She nurtured and shared it with others. This is part of her legacy.

In memory of Nancy, in honor of the Fête du Muguet, as a token of appreciation for you, and to inspire your reflection on how you are cultivating the true, the good, and the beautiful that will be part of your legacy, I leave you with a photo of lily of the valley---the flower for May!



GATHERING INPUT FOR THE DRE SEARCH

As you know, Joyce Duncan is retiring after serving as Director of Religious Exploration at TUUC for 18 years. The DRE Search Committee is gathering input from the whole congregation that will inform the future of RE at TUUC as well as selection of a new DRE. RE has undergone changes across the UU community that predate the pandemic, and many congregations are exploring new models for faith formation.

This will be a part-time position (20 hours a week with benefits), and will start as early as the beginning of September. We will be hiring a consultant to assist the candidate and the congregation to do the interim work that is necessary when a DRE director departs. The RE Committee is committed to offering a full RE program in the fall, which we are currently planning. We do need teachers, so please consider volunteering!

We will be holding all-congregation listening sessions via Zoom on May 16th and May 19th at 7:30pm, and at a coffee hour following the service on May 22. RE teachers will also have conversations on this topic with students in their classes. The feedback that we get from these conversations will be very helpful to us as we go through the process of screening and interviewing candidates. Registration is now open for both in-person and/or virtual participation. Virtual registration costs \$275. New this year is a Business-only virtual voting delegate option, donation to be determined by the delegate.

The stewardship of TUUC members and friends is our largest source of income. At present, Finance Head Dan Alper is working through the second draft of a budget for fiscal year 22-23. The first draft has already been reviewed by the A-Team and by the Board. All committee



chairs, staff, and program leaders should have already submitted their budget requests to Dan. All members and pledging friends should have already submitted their pledge for the next fiscal year. Once the Board approves a draft budget, it will be sent to members; the congregation will vote to approve the draft budget at our June 12 annual meeting.



The top five items that ACTC is requesting are: pasta, pasta sauce, cereal, peanut butter, and Pop Tarts.




