FAITHFUL RESPONSES TO HEADLINES THIS MONTH

Our monthly Soul Matter's theme at TUUC is "Nurturing Beauty." National news stories this month have made it more difficult and also an imperative to nurture beauty.

Please know that in response to the leaked news that the Supreme Court is prepared to overturn Roe V. Wade, the Unitarian Universalist Association issued this statement:

"As Unitarian Universalists, we believe that all bodies are sacred. Every person has the right to determine if, when, and how they want to have children. As people of faith, this commitment is part of our sincerest religious values: Unitarian Universalism proclaims that all individuals and communities have the right to self-determination, safety, and the resources that are necessary for health and sustainability.

As a faith tradition, we are committed to Reproductive Justice, which espouses the human right to have children, not to have children, to parent the children one has in healthy environments and to safeguard bodily autonomy and to express one's sexuality freely. In 2015, we issued a Statement of Conscience embracing this framework, which was created by women of color in the 1990s. We remain dedicated to this work."

In response to the mass shooting at Tops, the UUA's Side With Love team issued this statement: "This latest attack is the result of a society that is rooted in white supremacy. This violence begins with people aligning themselves with white supremacy, however, it shows up in our lives. It shows up with believing that white lives should be protected over Black lives–knowing that Black children playing on playgrounds or sleeping in their homes are killed by police without hesitation, while white assailants are taken safely into custody. It shows up with packaging genocidal movements in language like 'Replacement Theory.' It shows up when the media calls Mike Brown an '18-year-old man' and the Buffalo shooter a 'white teenager.' Whether it is the lie of a stolen election or calling a deadly insurrection 'legitimate political discourse,' we must remember that 'those who can make you believe absurdities can make you commit atrocities.' White supremacy, in all its expressions, is violence. And until we collectively commit to eradicating that root structure, this violence will continue.

We must keep telling the truth, keep fighting, keep building a shared story and collective power because in our bones—we know another world is possible. As Black movement builder and Director of the Working Families Party Moe Mitchell said this morning, 'If you don't think change is possible, organizing is not your ministry.' We begin with truth-telling and moving together in that truth. Another world is possible if we build it together."

And in response to the grim news that the United States has surpassed 1 million deaths from Covid, The Reverend Susan Frederick Grey, President of the UUA, wrote: *"We mourn for all who have died from COVID-19, and we grieve with the millions more who have been impacted by it…. From the beginning of the pandemic, the country failed to center our response on supporting the well-being of the most vulnerable in our communities, which led to BIPOC and disabled people bearing the brunt of both illness and death. As a religious community, we know that no one is outside the circle of love, that every person has worth and dignity, and that love and compassion are the foundation for the world we need."*

Love and compassion are the foundation for the world we need when it comes to women's reproductive health, to naming and changing our white supremacist culture, and to caring for each other through yet another wave of this pandemic. We need one another. And we need to nurture beauty to renew our spirits for the work ahead.

GATHERING INPUT FOR THE DRE SEARCH

As you know, Joyce Duncan is retiring after serving as Director of Religious Exploration at TUUC for 18 years. The DRE Search Committee is gathering input from the whole congregation that will inform the future of RE at TUUC as well as selection of a new DRE. RE has undergone changes across the UU community that predate the pandemic, and many congregations are exploring new models for faith formation.

This will be a part-time position (20 hours a week with benefits), and will start as early as the beginning of September. We will be hiring a consultant to assist the candidate and the congregation to do the interim work that is necessary when a DRE director departs. The RE Committee is committed to offering a full RE program in the fall, which we are currently planning. We do need teachers, so please consider volunteering!

We will be holding all-congregation listening sessions via Zoom on May 16th and May 19th at 7:30pm, and at a coffee hour following the service on May 22. RE teachers will also have conversations on this topic with students in their classes. The feedback that we get from these conversations will be very helpful to us as we go through the process of screening and interviewing candidates. The stewardship of TUUC members and friends is our largest source of income. At present, Finance Head Dan Alper is working through the second draft of a budget for fiscal year 22-23. The first draft has already been reviewed by the A-Team and by the Board. All committee



chairs, staff, and program leaders should have already submitted their budget requests to Dan. All members and pledging friends should have already submitted their pledge for the next fiscal year. Once the Board approves a draft budget, it will be sent to members; the congregation will vote to approve the draft budget at our June 12 annual meeting.


