# JUNETEENTH FREEDOM DAY

Juneteenth (officially Juneteenth National Independence Day, and also known as, Jubilee Day, Emancipation Day, Freedom Day, and Black Independence Day) is a federal holiday in the United States commemorating emancipation of enslaved African Americans. It is also often observed for celebrating African-American culture. Originating in Galveston, Texas, it has been celebrated annually on June 19 in various parts of the United States since 1865. The day was recognized as a federal holiday on June 17, 2021, when President Joe Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act into law. Juneteenth's commemoration is on the anniversary date of the June 19, 1865, announcement of General Order No. 3 by Union Army general Gordon Granger, proclaiming freedom for enslaved people in Texas, which was the last state of the Confederacy with institutional slavery.

# **CLARE'S COLLOQUY**

"The sweet June days are come again; the birds are on the wing..." Samuel Longfellow

In these sweet June days, we are expecting the installation of our new church sign with its lighted Pride flag chalice to signal that ours is a community of welcome for those with myriad identities and orientations and truths---not just in June---but every day.

In these sweet June days, the staff will be taking the Monday after Juneteenth as a holiday. For the first time, and thanks to the organizing by Black elders over decades, we are recognizing that Juneteenth is not just an African American holiday celebrating the emancipation of enslaved people after the Civil War. It is a national American holiday of freedom and liberation.

In these sweet June days, we honor fathers of all kinds and, in the words of Rev. Evin Carvill-Ziemer, the "radical idea that men have the full capacity to nurture."

In these sweet June days, here in Maryland, we celebrate the longest day of the year---the summer solstice---and the longest hours of sunlight that literally brighten our days.

Yet, in these sweet June days, we are still processing pain, grief, anger and despair from all the bad, difficult, irrational news in our country and our world and seeking a better way. Some will be participating in The March For Our Lives (against gun violence) from 10 a.m. – noon in Washington, DC on June 11<sup>th</sup>. Others will be participating in vigils for reproductive justice when the Supreme Court announces its ruling on Roe V. Wade. And, through the Unitarian Universalist Service Committee, we continue to support the people in Ukraine.

So that we do not have to celebrate, grieve, and act alone, we gather in religious community. In these sweet June days, we will hold our Annual Congregational Meeting at noon on June 12th both in the Meeting Room and in Zoom. We will elect new leadership, thank outgoing leaders, vote on our annual budget, and vote on a resolution to adopt the 8<sup>th</sup> Principle for our congregation:

"We, the member congregations of the Unitarian Universalist Association, covenant to affirm and promote: journeying toward spiritual wholeness by working to build a diverse multicultural Beloved Community by our actions that accountably dismantle racism and other oppressions in ourselves and our institutions."

This principle supports our congregation's mission "to deepen our ethical and spiritual lives by working for racial, social, and environmental justice."

When the sweet June days come again, when the birds are on the wing, may we support one another through the challenges we face in our own lives and in the world. May we be, in the words of John O'Donohue, "compassionate of heart, clear in word, gracious in awareness, courageous in thought, and generous in love."

Virtual registration costs \$275. The suggested donation for attending only the business sessions (as a delegate) is \$100.



### **EARL'S PLACE DONATIONS**


In addition, there is a round bin marked "Earl's Place" for donations of paper goods and toiletries, such as toilet paper or paper towels.
