



USHERS NEEDED

Now that TUUC has returned to in person services, several people who have ushered for many years have retired from this volunteer task.

Ushers help get the meeting room ready by putting out the bowls of water for joys and concern, making sure there is enough oil in the chalice, and putting orders of service by the doors to the meeting room. They count the number of people who are attending. After people have placed their offering in the plate at the front of the room, the ushers count the money. At the end of the service, they empty the bowls of water, dry off the stones and return them to the baskets, collect used orders of service and put them in the recycling bin and send attendance information to Philip.

WORTHY NOW PRISON MINISTRY

Our worship service on June 26th was about the Worthy Now Prison Ministry, which is a ministry of the UU Church of the Larger Fellowship. Worthy Now invites people on both sides of prison walls into beloved community. We declare that all persons are worthy of



love, respect, and support — not at some future time when we are better people — but as we are right now. There is a need for free-world UU's to be pen pals with incarcerated UU's. Sue Royer shared her experience being a pen pal during the service and encourages you to consider becoming a pen pal.

Most Church of the Larger Fellowship (CLF) members in prison are new to Unitarian Universalism and learned about the CLF from friends or cellmates. With no access to the web or UU Sunday services, people who are incarcerated can only learn about Unitarian Universalism from the mailings sent to them and the letters they exchange with CLF staff and other Unitarian Universalists like us! To become a pen pal, you must be at least 21 years old, be a member of a UU congregation for six months or more, affirm you have not been arrested, incarcerated, or on parole or probation in the prior 12 months, and read and agree to the guidelines of the program.

Nonperishable food can be dropped off at these locations:


- Mondays, 12 to 2 PM: Ascension Lutheran Church parking lot (7601 York Rd.)
