#### **SOUL MATTERS SHARING CIRCLES**

Soul Matters Sharing Circles are small groups that meet to explore our spiritual theme of the month in greater depth by fostering circles of trust and deep listening. Each participant is provided with a packet which includes exercises to experience the theme of the month and not just analyze the theme. In addition, each packet includes questions to walk with and not talk through. Participants bring their life story as a way to answer the question.

There are additional resources in the packet for contemplation and spiritual practice. These are not intended to be stand alone sessions. Instead, participants are asked to commit to attend as many of the eight sessions as possible. Soul Matters sharing circles will re-open in February if this is a better time of the year for you. #### WRITING AS A SPIRITUAL PRACTICE—DROP IN SESSIONS

Writing As A Spiritual Practice will resume on September 23 and all are welcome to these stand alone sessions on Zoom. Through this practice we become more present to our own lives and get to know the lives of others at a deeper level. We close with a benediction. #### **BE A MONITOR AT TUUC!**

Towson Unitarian Universalist Church (TUUC) derives income from renting our facility to external groups when not in use by the congregation for church events. The monitor is to ensure that both the Church and the renter are satisfied with their use of church facilities.

The monitor role is to ensure that the church facility is appropriately used and in accordance with the TUUC Facility Use Policy to protect the Church building and resources from misuse and damage. As a representative of TUUC it is also the monitor's responsibility to ensure that the renter's use of the facilities is as smooth and trouble free as possible.

#### **REVISED COVID PLAN FOR TUUC**

The CDC has revised its guidance on Covid. The A-Team has updated our guidelines for our congregation. While we encourage everyone to be vaccinated and boosted (if eligible), we are not requiring those who enter our building to show proof of vaccination. We are no longer requiring registration for worship.

Because we are currently in the "yellow" zone, we are still requiring masks in the building and planning to offer hospitality (i.e., eating and drinking) outside.

We ask that if you do test positive shortly after attending TUUC, please let Rev. Clare know so that we inform those with whom you may have been in closer contact in the building.

#### SACRED CURRICULUM ON FAITH SUPPORT FOR REPRODUCTIVE FREEDOM

A new national organization called SACReD, the Spiritual Alliance of Communities for Reproductive Dignity (<a href="http://www.sacreddignity.org/">http://www.sacreddignity.org/</a>) has formed to empower congregations to become loving, justice-seeking faith communities that fully support the fulfillment of reproductive moral agency and flourishing for all. SACReD has developed a curriculum to help participants deepen their understanding of the connection between faith, racism, and reproductive ethics, and to identify strategies and actions for liberation within religious communities and the larger world.

Given that the Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade—and that many people have never had meaningful access to reproductive healthcare—it is a critical time to learn and to act. Rev. Clare will be offering this curriculum in seven 2-hour sessions on Zoom, 1:00-3:00 PM. The first session will be offered on Sunday Oct. 2 and repeated on October 30th.

Participants are required to attend the first session. That's why it is being offered twice. The other sessions will be held on Nov. 13, Jan. 8. Feb. 5, March 5, April 2, and April 30. Participants are required to attend at least 6 of the 8 sessions including the first one. 




