

CLARE'S COLLOQUY

Groucho Marx is reported to have once said, "I don't want to belong to any club that would have me as a member." His son explained the origin of this one-liner, Once....when he was in a gregarious mood, he let some friends persuade him to join the Friars Club. After months of refusing to take part in any of the club's activities, he finally decided it was foolish to pay dues any longer and sent in his resignation. In the next mail, he received a letter from the club's president, wanting to know why he had resigned. My father promptly wrote back, "Because I don't want to belong to any club that would have me as a member!"

We are a church, not a club. But I have been thinking about this story in the context of our September spiritual theme of "Belonging." What does it mean? Does it mean that we long for a welcome to be ourselves in religious community, to be accepted for who we are? Does it mean that we are longing to be not merely observers but participants in community, engaged in the mission and work of the congregation? Are the two entwined? Do we become who we long to be by supporting our mission to deepen our spiritual and ethical lives by working for racial, social, and environmental justice?

The Soul Matters Sharing Circle packet for September offers the antithesis of Groucho Marx's pithy retort that he didn't want to belong to any club that would have him as a member. It offers this challenge: the true blessing of belonging is not that you get to come inside the circle; it's that you get to participate in expanding it.

With this in mind, for Water Communion on September 11th, you are invited to bring a small vial of water symbolizing a quality of talent or gift that you are bringing to TUUC to grow into the person you long to be thereby expanding the possibilities for what our community longs to become. On September 18th, Hannah Freeman, from BRIDGE, Maryland and I will dialogue on what it means for our congregation to belong to BRIDGE. Unlike the Friar's Club, this organization develops public relationships to promote policies to realize equity in our common life. How do we do this? Nancy Caswell and Ann Beazley will share what they learned at a training for BRIDGE, Maryland.

And on September 25th, our Membership Committee will reflect on what belonging to TUUC really means. In the words of Jan Richardson, "It desires for you to become the sanctuary that you have found..."

Welcome back to, if not THE place where you belong, a people to whom you belong who accept you for who you are and invite you to become who you yearn to be. Together, may we realize our collective longing for all to know they are whole and holy.

"Our Messy Lives" will be discussing CLARITY, suggested by our insightful participant, Liora, at our August session, at our next get together on Thursday afternoon, September 15th, from 3:00-4:00 p.m. For newcomers who would like to join us, just send an email to Nancy Caswell, Zoom Host and Facilitator, whose info may be found on the database, TUUC Breeze. The Zoom Link will arrive in your Inbox the day before! "Clarity!" Rev. Clare used the word in her Homily about the Cosmos last Sunday: "to see the stars with clarity", said she. On the 15th, our tenminute writing exercise will be prompted by such questions as: "When have you experienced something with clarity?" And: "Using Alan Jay Lerner's (1965) 'On a Clear Day (You Can See Forever)' lyrics, tell of a time when these words may have happened to you and how they made you feel: 'On a clear day, rise and look around you, and you'll see who you are...how it will astound you that the glow of your being outshines every star"... And lastly, "How do the words describing clarity, in the 1972 reggae song by Johnny Nash, 'I Can See Clearly Now (the Rain is Gone), resonate with you? They are: 'I can make it now, the pain is gone...gone are the dark clouds that had me blind... all of the bad feelings have disappeared...nothing but blue skies....it's gonna be a bright, bright sunshinin' day!" And I might ask, "Can we see with *clarity* every day or only occasionally?" The James Webb telescope has helped us to see, with more clarity, "the spacious firmament on high," as the words of the hymn we sang Sunday go! With many other Unitarian Universalist congregations, TUUC participates in a theme-based ministry program called "Soul Matters." We are currently forming Soul Matter Sharing Circles which will meet every other Tuesday from 7:30-9:00 PM. Each participant will receive a packet which includes spiritual practices; questions for reflection; and readings and music pertaining to the theme. The themes for the next five months include *Belonging, Courage, Change, Wonder,* and *Finding our Center.*

Participants are asked to covenant to attend as many of the upcoming 8 sessions as possible. If you would like to participate, or have questions about Soul Matters Sharing Circles, please e-mail Rev. WRITING AS A SPIRITUAL PRACTICE—DROP IN SESSIONS

Sept. 23, Oct. 7, Oct. 21, Nov. 4, Nov. 18, Dec. 9, Jan. 6, Jan. 20 from 1-2 PM on Zoom

Writing As A Spiritual Practice will resume on September 23 and all are welcome to these stand alone sessions on Zoom. We check-in; light a chalice; listen to a brief reading; and then choose one of several prompts. After writing together for 15 minutes in silence, we are invited to share what we have written. Through this practice we become more present to our own lives and get to know the lives of others at a deeper level. We close with a benediction. The purpose of this group is not perfection it is presence. Join us on one or all of the Friday sessions above!

SACRED CURRICULUM ON FAITH SUPPORT FOR REPRODUCTIVE FREEDOM

A new national organization called SACReD, the Spiritual Alliance of Communities for Reproductive Dignity (http://www.sacreddignity.org/) has formed to empower congregations to become loving, justice-seeking faith communities that fully support the fulfillment of reproductive moral agency and flourishing for all. SACReD has developed a curriculum to help participants deepen their understanding of the connection between faith, racism, and

reproductive ethics, and to identify strategies and actions for liberation within religious communities and the larger world.

Given that the Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade—and that many people have never had meaningful access to reproductive healthcare—it is a critical time to learn and to act. Rev. Clare will be offering this curriculum in seven 2-hour sessions on Zoom, 1:00-3:00 PM. The first session will be offered on Sunday Oct. 2 and repeated on October 30th.

Participants are required to attend the first session. That's why it is being offered twice. The other sessions will be held on Nov. 13, Jan. 8. Feb. 5, March 5, April 2, and April 30. Participants are required to attend at least 6 of the 8 sessions including the first one. Please register here if you would like to participate. Your participation will help TUUC to become an official part of this interfaith Spiritual Alliance of Communities for Reproductive Dignity.




