

NEXT SOCRATES CAFÉ TO CONSIDER THE MERICRATIC IDEAL-MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 19

"What's become of the common good?" is the question our next TUUC Socrates Cafe will be considering and probing this coming Monday evening, September 19th from 7:30-9:00 PM on Zoom. As a follow up to our August discussion, Peter Talley suggested that we consider reading Michael Sandel's book, The Tyranny of Merit. Or watch Sandel, an important and influential living philosopher, share his ideas and principles by Googling selected YouTubes as background material to bring to this, our 25th TUUC Socrates Cafe. A suggestion is Sandel's excellent 8:48 minutes TED Talk, "The Tyranny of Merit," which describes Meritocracy, a questionable political system, where people are chosen and moved into positions of success, power, and influence on the basis of their demonstrated abilities and merit, and where Sandel proposes that "only the elite, in that new Meritocracy, would enjoy the opportunity for selffulfillment." Further, Sandel advises: "The Meritocratic Ideal is not a remedy for inequality, it is a justification for inequality!" How do we of the TUUC Socrates Cafe see it? We check-in; light a chalice; listen to a brief reading; and then choose one of several prompts. After writing together for 15 minutes in silence, we are invited to share what we have written. Through this practice we become more present to our own lives and get to know the lives of others at a deeper level. We close with a benediction. The purpose of this group is not perfection it is presence. Join us on one or all of the Friday sessions above!

SACRED CURRICULUM ON FAITH SUPPORT FOR REPRODUCTIVE FREEDOM

A new national organization called SACReD, the Spiritual Alliance of Communities for Reproductive Dignity (<u>http://www.sacreddignity.org/</u>) has formed to empower congregations to become loving, justice-seeking faith communities that fully support the fulfillment of reproductive moral agency and flourishing for all. SACReD has developed a curriculum to help participants deepen their understanding of the connection between faith, racism, and reproductive ethics, and to identify strategies and actions for liberation within religious communities and the larger world.

Given that the Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade—and that many people have never had meaningful access to reproductive healthcare—it is a critical time to learn and to act. Rev. Clare will be offering this curriculum in seven 2-hour sessions on Zoom, 1:00-3:00 PM. The first session will be offered on Sunday Oct. 2 and repeated on October 30th.

Participants are required to attend the first session. That's why it is being offered twice. The other sessions will be held on Nov. 13, Jan. 8. Feb. 5, March 5, April 2, and April 30. Participants are required to attend at least 6 of the 8 sessions including the first one. Please register <u>here</u> if you would like to participate. Your participation will help TUUC to become an official part of this interfaith Spiritual Alliance of Communities for Reproductive Dignity.
