





CLARE'S COLLOQUY

Our spiritual theme this month is walking the path of love. For some, the word "love" evokes memories of a cherished family member from childhood. For others, the word holds Hallmark romance connotations. Some associate the word with friendship. Others think of care for children and great grandchildren. And some would rather not hear the word "love" because it is overused and under exemplified.

This month, at TUUC, we will be reflecting on what we mean when we say that we aspire to be a beloved community. What does beloved community look like, sound like, and feel like? Gwendolyn Brooks offers this vision of beloved community:

We are each other's harvest; we are each other's business; we are each other's magnitude and bond.

Over the next eight weeks, during our stewardship campaign we will be invited to explore what this looks, sounds, and feels like for our beloved community (and the future we hope to create together) through a collective art project. You may expect to receive invitations to write, draw, and take photographs over the next eight weeks. During this time, you will also be invited to make an annual pledge to invest in your vision for our beloved community beginning July 1, 2023.

At the same time, we will be launching our Sacred Listening Campaign for BRIDGE, MD. The purpose of this listening campaign is to get to know one another through 30 minute one on one visits in which the listener will be asking questions like:

What has your faith journey been?
What brought you to TUUC and keeps you here?
What makes you mad (what issues violate your values) to the point of taking action?

These Sacred Conversations are about getting to know each other at a deeper level than coffee hour allows. They are about learning each other's unique story. And they are about identifying public issues we are willing to act upon in concert with others.

These Sacred Conversations are not about therapy, nor to do a needs assessment for TUUC, nor to ask for money.

They are focused on building public relationships to understand the experiences that motivate us to act on issues of justice. We expect common themes to emerge with regard to where we see our core values being violated in the public arena. We will be sharing these common issues with BRIDGE, MD so that we can discern the justice issues around which our congregations of different social, racial, and religious identities can work together.

When you receive an invitation to have a Sacred Conversation, please say, "Yes." So far, we have 9 trained "listeners." If you would like to be connected to a sacred listener, please e-mail me at revclare@towsonuuc.org.

This is an exciting time in the life of our congregation!

We are walking the path of love by celebrating the beloved community that we are. We are imagining the beloved community that we can become and investing in this vision. And we are joining with other congregations who are doing the same that we might, indeed, be each other's harvest, be each other's business, and be each other's magnitude and bond.



DONATIONS AT TUUC

We are again collecting donations of nonperishable food for the Assistance Center of Towson Churches (ACTC). Please deposit them in the round bin (Marked ACTC) on the floor of the Church lobby. The most requested food items are: boxed breakfast cereal, canned meals (pork & beans, chili), canned vegetables, canned fruit, dry pasta, pasta sauce, Mac & cheese, canned tuna, peanut butter, jelly, canned soup, family and travel sized toiletries, and household supplies (toilet paper, laundry detergent). In addition, there is a round bin marked "Earl's Place" for donations of paper goods and toiletries, such as toilet paper or paper towels.

MARYLAND GENERAL ASSEMBLY


