TUUC YOUTH RELIGIOUS EXPLORATION—RAMADAN MUBARAK!

This Sunday, we will be learning about Ramadan. This period of fasting celebrates the transmission of the Quoran from Allah to Mohammed. Children, Pregnant/Nursing Women, the elderly, and those who are ill are not required to fast.

The first night (March 21st) begins approximately a month of fasting during the day, and community celebrations and feasts at night, culminating in Eid al-Fitr (festival of sweets), occurs on the last night of Ramadan, celebrating the breaking of the fast and to honor the heart work celebrants have done over the month. Ramadan is a time of deep reflection and prayer, and through these celebrations, Muslims show their gratitude to Allah.

K-8th Grade will be learning about this tradition and trying some traditional foods like dates. Ask them about the new words they learned during class or about the tradition of Ramadan!







HELP SUPPORT OUR VALUES THROUGH THE UNITARIAN UNIVERSALIST LEGISLATIVE MINISTRY (UULM)

One of TUUC's Partners is the Unitarian Universalist Legislative Ministry of Maryland (UULM-MD) is a statewide action network of Unitarian Universalists who work to support UU values. They educate, engage, and mobilize UUs to advocate for specific issues before the Maryland General Assembly. Working in coalition with local, state and national organizations, we as UUs promote UU values through legislation which affirms:

- the inherent worth and dignity of all,
- reverence for the interdependent web of all existence, and
- justice, health and equity in society.
- It approaches each issue through an anti-racism/anti-oppression lens to deepen an understanding of the impact of policies on historically marginalized communities and people of color.

This organization is, of course, very active before and during the MD legislative Session, which is going on <u>right now</u>, from the middle of January 11 until April 10. You can become a member of UU Legislative Ministries by donating as little as \$25 on their website, which is <u>uulmmd.org</u>.

If you are particularly interested in one issue, you can become involved in legislation for issues such as: Medical Aid in Dying [MAID], Immigration, Climate Change, Criminal Justice Reform, Healthcare, and Gun Violence. You can monitor proposed legislation or get involved, at the website—<u>uulmmd.org</u>.
