BELTANE RITUAL—SUNDAY, APRIL 30 AT 7:00 PM

Beltane is one of the eight sabbats on the Pagan wheel of the year. For the ancient Celts, Beltane marks the beginning of summer when the cattle were sent into the summer pastures. Meaning "bright fire" Beltane was celebrated by lighting two fires and driving cattle between the fires, which



were thought to protect the animals from harm and to boost their fertility. We may not keep cattle today, but the ideas underlying this holy day are still compelling. For modern Pagans, we celebrate not only the waxing sun and fertility of Earth, but also our own internal flames of creativity in body, mind, and spirit. Join us on Sunday, April 30 at 7 pm in Thoreau Meadow as we light our Beltane fire and celebrate the coming of summer. Bring food to share and a donation for ACTC. Drums will be welcome as we dance around the fire. In case of rain, the maypole dance and ritual will be moved indoors.

For families, we will also dance around the maypole right after the church service on April 30 (approximately 11:45 am). Children of all ages are most welcome to join us in the dance and making wreaths of flowers.

THE FACES OF DEPRESSION: MAY 1, MAY 8, MAY 15, AND MAY 20

May is National Mental Health Awareness Month. One of the major mental health issues of our time is depression. Statistics show that 20 percent of adult Americans can expect to experience clinical depression at least once.



In the 18th and 19th century, depression, also known as melancholia, was thought to be a character trait that was


inherited and could not be changed. Today, we understand it as a disease that can be treated. Nevertheless, there is much about depression that is still not understood, and stigma attached to depression remains a problem. For those suffering from depression and those close to them, depression can seem mysterious and impossible to cure.

In this 4-week course, led by Rev. Karyn Marsh, who is a chaplain at Johns Hopkins Hospital, participants will learn to recognize the signs and symptoms of depression, about treatments for depression, and how to support those who are experiencing depression. While this course is designed for those who are supporting people with depression, it will also offer resources for participants to tend to their own mental health.

The first three classes will be held via zoom on Mondays, May 1, May 8, and May 15, from 7 pm until 8 pm. The final class session will be in-person at TUUC on May 20 from 1 pm until 3 pm. NAMING THE NEW TRAIL

Have you walked the recently constructed trail that runs through the woods on our property? We are grateful to those who have helped establish this path. Their work has provided us a place for contemplation and observation.

At this moment, the trail is unnamed. At their most recent meeting in March, members of the Board proposed calling it the TUUC Ancestors Trail. The intention was to acknowledge, not only those members of our congregation who have come before us, but also the previous stewards of our land. The path travels from the Memorial Garden to the Thoreau Meadow across grounds that were once worked by enslaved Africans and, before that, controlled by the Piscataway- Conoy Nation. Under this proposal, we will work to create a marker explaining the history of the land and acknowledging the previous inhabitants. This marker will be dedicated upon its installation.

It is with sadness that I share news of the death of Peter Liveright on Sunday. He was one of the first people I met at The Towson Unitarian Universalist Church in 1999. He served on the Ministerial Search Committee and shared his wonderful wit and background in Human Resources. It was always a pleasure to visit with Peter and his wife of 63 years, Barbara, and see photographs of their travels around the country. Peter was Barbara's devoted caretaker when she developed dementia.

Peter was committed to TUUC and served for 13 years on the TUUC Personnel Committee. He was also a UUA compensation consultant for the Joseph Priestley District for many years. One of my fondest memories of Peter was attending a workshop at the UUA General Assembly on an Aesthetics of Jazz offered by Professor Sharon Welch. As we waited for the lecture to begin, Peter's eyes looked into the past as he shared memories of the jazz he heard in New York City.

DONATIONS AT TUUC

Assistance Center of Towson Churches (ACTC) still need donations. Please deposit them in the round bin (Marked ACTC) on the floor of the Church lobby. The most requested food items are: boxed breakfast cereal, canned meals (pork & beans, chili), canned vegetables, canned fruit, dry pasta, pasta sauce, Mac & cheese, canned tuna, peanut butter, jelly, canned soup, family and travel sized toiletries, and household supplies (toilet paper, laundry detergent). In addition, there is a round bin marked "Earl's Place" for donations of paper goods and toiletries, such as toilet paper or paper towels.

When the General Assembly adjourned "sine die" 4/10/2023, 30 of UULM-MD's 67 priority bills had passed (45%). In terms of issues (rather than individual bills), the record is even better: 20 of 36 issues (56%).
