# **CLARE'S COLLOQUY**

Delight is like the butterflies flying around and landing on the thing that is joy. ---Ross Gay

Ross Gay turned 42 and gave himself the challenge of writing about something that delighted him each day for a year. He thought it was going to mean paying greater attention to the world around him including watching a dandelion grow through a crack in the sidewalk. That's how his practice began. But over time he discovered that what unveiled delight for him was "so often personal interactions" so he became "aware that delight is sort of a manifestation of interdependence." As he headed into the news cycles in the fall of 2016, he realized his practice was being shaped by the need to find and be light. After writing for a year about delight, he discerned that his life's work would be to help people get in touch with what moves them---not just what they like---but what they love. His focus became the question, "How can we love each other better?"

It's no accident that our Soul Matters theme for June is walking the path of delight.

We will begin by celebrating the 100th anniversary of the Flower Ceremony created by Norbert Capek for the Unitarian congregation in Prague on June 4, 1923. Please bring a flower (or several) from your garden or from the roadside or even growing through a crack in the sidewalk. At the end of the ceremony, you will receive a flower brought by another.

We will continue to walk the path of delight with summer memories from childhood of interdependence. Was it making ice cream by hand with family members? Going berry picking? Catching fireflies with neighbors? Building sandcastles on the beach with family and other children you did not know? After worship on June 11 all members will participate in the delights of our Annual Meeting. I do not mean this ironically. We affirm our interdependence by choosing new leaders and voting on how we will fulfill our values through our annual budget.

On June 18th we will celebrate the delights and possibilities of love with the wedding of Lou Geiszl and Eleanor Hughes who met at TUUC teaching Sunday School. June 18th is also Father's Day!

How we can love each other better will be a question for delegates to the Unitarian Universalist General Assembly as we vote on the proposed Article II draft which puts love at the center of our faith.

The world still needs us to find and be the light. June 19th the office will be closed to celebrate Juneteenth---which commemorates when General Gordon Granger issued an order to enforce the Emancipation Proclamation in Texas and all enslaved people in Texas knew they were freed. And yet, in the past week, Amanda Gorman's poem, "The Hill We Climb" was banned from an elementary school in Florida because one parent complained about it being "divisive." In reality, Gorman's poem is all about unifying our country. What is divisive is racism.

All of June is Pride month, a time to intentionally celebrate the freedom to be oneself in relation to others. This freedom is being challenged in too many states. Target made a corporate decision to remove Pride related products and relocate Pride displays to the back of certain stores in the South. But we Unitarian Universalists delight in the freedom to be oneself in relation to others. The Progress Pride flag is at the front of our church in the chalice of our congregation's sign which lights up at night serving as a beacon for inclusivity and delighting in each person's unique gifts.

This month, as we walk the path of delight together, may we discover ourselves to be "like the butterflies flying around and landing on the thing that is joy."

## **CELEBRATING OUR ANCESTORS**

Last month, the TUUC Board of Trustees solicited feedback on a proposal to christen the newly created path through our property the TUUC Ancestors Trail. We appreciate the thoughtful and heartfelt feedback we received from several members.

At their May 17 meeting, the Board weighed these suggestions and voted to officially adopt the name Ancestors Trail for this path. The Board felt that this best encompassed our desire to honor those who helped create and grow our church as well as those who lived and worked on this land long before the church was created.

In the coming year, our website will be revamped and updated, and a detailed history of the original trail, the Francis Pettijohn Trail, will be included on our site alongside a description of the Ancestors Trail. A marker will be commissioned and dedicated to acknowledge the contributions of Dr. Pettijohn and other founders, as well as the indigenous people and enslaved Africans who came before us.

#### NEXT TUUC BLOOD DRIVE—THURSDAY, JUNE 15




