

TUUC CHOIR TO RESUME FOR THE NEW SEASON

Our TUUC Choir has had their well-deserved break this summer, and will resume rehearsals soon. If you've been considering singing with the choir, the beginning of the season is a great time to start! First rehearsal will be on Thursday, August 31st at 7:30 PM, and we'll sing a little bit on Sunday, September 3rd. Since we know that many of you are away over that first weekend, we'll have a small Welcome party prior to rehearsal on Thursday, Sept. 7th. Our TUUC Choir rehearses weekly on Thursdays from 7:30 to 9:30, and sings two or three times per month in Sunday services. You'll receive a schedule for choir Sundays to help you plan. We sing a variety of styles--contemporary choral, folk, Classical, show tunes, traditional music from around the world, pop, etc. It's a great group of people, and in this post-pandemic time, about half of the choir is relatively new to it. Some experience with reading music is helpful, but not required--you'll learn a lot as you go. Alternatively (or in addition!), we have something called Community Choir approximately every six weeks. On those Sundays, anyone can "walk in" and learn the music on the morning of the Sunday service. Yes, you'll need to come pretty early (we need to do soundchecks for Zoom prior to the service, AFTER the rehearsal), but this is so much fun! All ages are invited, and the music is a little simpler. We have a great time on those Sundays. Whether you decide

to join us for TUUC Choir (with rehearsals on Thursday evenings), or for the Community Choir Sundays--or both!--we welcome you and look forward to making music with you!

WRITING AS A SPIRITUAL PRACTICE—DROP IN SESSIONS ON SEPT 8 & 22, OCT 6 & 20, NOV 3 AND 17, DEC 1 AND 15, JAN 5 AND 19 FROM 1 TO 2 PM ON ZOOM

Writing as a Spiritual Practice will resume on September 8 and all are welcome to these biweekly stand-alone sessions on Zoom. We check-in; light a chalice; listen to a brief reading; and then choose one of several prompts. After writing together for 15 minutes in silence, we are invited to share what we have written (although there is no obligation to share). Through this practice we become more present to our own lives and get to know the lives of others at a deeper level. We close with a benediction. The purpose of this group is not perfection it is presence. Please join us on one of the Friday sessions above. You will discover deep connections as well as wonderful writers!

- Thursdays, 5 to 6 PM: Valley Baptist Church parking lot (1401 York Rd.)





SOUL MATTERS SHARING CIRCLES REGISTRATION BY SEPTEMBER 12

Autumn is a time for the first day of the new school year; for the Jewish high holy days, remembering the beginning of the world and marking the start of a new year; and, perhaps, for committing to a new spiritual practice.

Our Soul Matters Sharing Circles will begin meeting on Zoom on September 26 to explore the monthly theme. Prior to gathering, you will receive a packet of possible spiritual practices; questions on the theme; and readings. Participants are invited to choose one spiritual practice to engage and one question to reflect upon. In a circle of six to ten people, we share our experience with the practice and our thoughts on the question. We learn more about ourselves and connect with others on a deeper level.

This year's themes are based on the values articulated in the proposed Article II revision which delegates to the UUA General Assembly will vote upon next June.

This year's overarching frame is *The Gifts of Our Faith*. We focus on ten beloved UU values and explore their potential to shape us and in turn shape the world.

How do these values offer us both challenge and comfort? What might it mean to place them at the center of our living and loving? What promise do they hold for us individually as well as collectively? These are some of questions that will guide and bless our journey in the year ahead.

Here is the list of our 2023-24 themes: *The Gift of...*

September: Welcome
October: Heritage
November: Generosity
December: Mystery
January: Liberating Love
February: Justice & Equity
March: Transformation
April: Interdependence

May: Pluralism June: Renewal

This year, we will experiment with meeting once a month for 1.5-2 hours (instead of twice a month). Therefore, we are asking participants to commit to meeting once a month so that we can really get to know one another. We understand that something may come up that will require missing a meeting or two. But these are not stand alone sessions. We are scheduled to meet on Sept. 26, Oct. 24, Nov. 28, Dec. 12, Jan. 30, Feb. 27, March 26, April 23, May 28, and June 11th.
