CLARE'S COLLOQUY

On the last weekend of February, walking with my father, we stopped to admire yellow crocuses; purple crocuses; and snowdrops---blossoms where, when we had walked four weeks earlier, there had been none. Nature, herself, had transformed the landscape from barren to blossoming.



The proposed revision to Article II of the Bylaws of the Unitarian Universalist Association lifts up "transformation" as one of our core values: "We adapt to a changing world." It is easier to adapt to the arrival of spring than it is to many of the headlines from around the globe. We need one another to remind us of life's goodness.

The walk with my father took us to a house whose owners decorate two pink yard flamingos to mark the changing seasons. At the end of February, one was still dressed for Valentine's Day with a heart headpiece as well as red Mardi Gras beads. The other was dressed for Mardi Gras with a mask headpiece and green and

purple beads. These neighbors intentionally offer the gift of whimsy to passersby.

Intentionally seeking individual and collective transformation is part of our purpose as a faith community. The proposed revision to Article II of the Bylaws of the Unitarian Universalist Association reads "We covenant to collectively transform and grow spiritually and ethically. Openness to change is fundamental to our Unitarian and Universalist heritages, never complete and never perfect."

In this season of Ramadan, Holi, Spring Equinox, and Easter, what transformation are you seeking? What transformations are you celebrating? And what transformations are you offering to a world in need of beauty, whimsy, love, hope, and peace?



INCLUSIONARY HOUSING SUCCESS IN BALTIMORE CITY

BRIDGE worked with the Inclusionary Housing Task Force for two years to support the two bills that make up the Inclusionary Housing package in Baltimore City. Mayor Scott signed the bills on January 22. The first outlines the requirements for large developments above 20 units to make 10% of their units affordable to 50% and 60% of Area Median Income residents. The



second is a tax credit that helps to pay for the lost rent for those units. 60% of Area Median Income (ALMI) is \$53,600 for a family of two, and \$67,000 for a family of four; and 50% of AMI is \$48,700 for a family of two, and \$60,850 for a family of four.
