[Project Drawdown](#) is a non-profit, international coalition of more than 200 researchers and other experts who research what is required for the earth to not just stabilize global warming but to start to reduce, i.e., "drawdown" CO₂, the major contributor to global warming. The research identifies the 80 most substantive solutions to global warming and models both CO₂ reductions and net savings for each. The Pachamama Alliance started as an indigenous people's rights group in Peru and has grown into a world-wide group of people working on the human aspects of stopping global warming. It focuses on the human aspects of changes needed to reach drawdown.

Reversing Global Warming: Introduction to Drawdown is a 2-hour in-person workshop that invites you to see both the possibility of reversing global warming and your possible roles to play in this process.

Drawdown Solutions: Getting into Action is a 5-session workshop that supports you in finding your unique contribution to reversing global warming and getting into action with a community of like-minded individuals. These vibrant workshops bring people together as a community to address local and national global warming solutions.
