A relational covenant is the shared expectations and aspirations of a community or group as to how each member wants to be treated in the life of the community.

The covenant becomes a set of promises to one another and to the community as a whole.

It is meant to be our shared values in action, expressed in a practical manner. This is critical to the nurturing of a community. It is an affirmation that our community wants to thrive.

Use of an Acronym

As we developed that list of shared expectations and hopes for our community, we chose to work with an acronym of T.R.U.E. for ease of reference. T.R.U.E. stands for Trust, Resolve, Understand, and Engage.
