What can you do?

- **Contact your representative** Don't know your representatives or their committee assignments? <u>Click here</u>, select "Look Up", then select the name of your member. The search results will show their phone, email, and committee assignments.
- Testify Anyone can offer testimony on a bill. You don't need to be a lawyer or lobbyist. You can offer both live and written testimony. Live testimony may be given in-person or via Zoom. Regardless of how you chose to testify, you must sign up <u>online</u> 1-2 days before the bill's hearing. The window to sign-up opens at 10am and closes at 6pm one (1) business day before Senate hearings and two (2) business days before House hearings. For more information about testifying, consult the guidelines for the <u>Senate</u> and <u>House</u>.

• Watch the hearing - You can also <u>watch bill hearings</u> online in real time or after the hearing has taken place.
